TREASURERS REPORT 2018

The last twelve months have remained financially steady for the majority of the equestrian community. Yet this year the club's total income is lower than last year.

Income for the club came from shows, the gymkhanas, the rallies and our Junior and Senior teams. The competitions at the club held their own but the clinic income was most affected being down 86% from last year! Despite this the club still managed to run a very successful series of shows, gymkhanas and rallies. Due to the early part of the year being affected by wet weather two of the clubs shows (show jumping and autumn showing) were ran later on in the year which was out of the club's financial year, meaning these amounts will roll over.

It is important to point out that if the weather did not delay shows in being run, that the club would have easily seen a profit. It is unfortunate that the weather caused such a negative effect on the club's finances for this financial year. (Oct 2017 to Sep 2018)

Unfortunately this year due to weather implications the club's camps were not as well attended. We are hoping 2019 proves more successful.

To help cover costs this year the club's junior and senior team riders have been helping to finance their team's costs.

The club has certain fixed overheads and ever increasing insurance costs but this year the majority of the club's expenditure has been put into improving and fixing the club's trophies. Our insurance costs this year have all increased by 26.5%.

This sees the club into a loss at the end of September 2018 of £1007.96.

Future ventures include investing in the toilet block, upgrading the tannoy system, first aid training and general maintenance of the club's field.

We ended the financial year with £6,891.52 in the bank.

The Charges are Flat Work £5.00 per horse per hour

Show Jumping £8.00 per horse per hour

The field will be available for hire most days unless it is closed for field maintenance or show preparation. It may be hired on show days after the show with the organiser's permission. Please book at least 24 hours before you require the field, if you have any doubt about the field condition please phone Carol

All riders must be accompanied by a responsible person. YOU MUST NOT BE ALONE. Parents must make the booking for Junior Members, who must be accompanied by a parent, senior member or instructor. Non members may ride members horses providing the member has made the booking and is present. The member will be responsible for the use of the field and the equipment.

Do not use the show jumping arena for flat work or grid work. LUNGING IS NOT ALLOWED ANYWHERE ON THE FIELD. Anyone misusing the field or equipment will not be allowed to hire the field again. They may have their club membership cancelled and will be refused future show entries.

WHEN YOU LEAVE PLEASE MAKE SURE BOTH GATES ARE CLOSED AND LOCKED, ALL POLES AND CUPS ARE OFF THE GROUND. DO NOT SWEEP TRAILERS AND LORRIES OUT ONTO THE FIELD.

Please report any breakages so they can be repaired. You will not be charged.

SENIOR TEAM REPORT 2018

I'd like to start by saying how grateful I am to the members who put so much effort in to representing the teams both on and off their horses. There have been some long days but help and support from everyone has made them fun.

Talking of long days the winter qualifiers can be marathons! We started with the novice and intermediate dressage qualifiers plus the FOTH combined training all at Brook farm a year ago. On this occasion we just had the one individual qualifier in Nicola Broadbent in the intermediate dressage at novice level.

The showjumping novice and intermediate ran together at Wix in November. Both the 100 team of myself, Sophie Dutton, Gail Jeffery and Frankie Power won as did the 110 team of Rachel Chisnell, Lorna Simpson, James Foxon and Christine Reidy.

The championships were unfortunately held at 8.30am on a school/college day which wiped out Sophie and Frankie so we had to hand the qualifying slot to Saffron Walden. The 110 team went and Lorna jumped 3 fantastic clears so finish 2nd individually.

After a miserable winter with the beast from the east affecting members fitness programs the FOTH eventer trial qualifier was held in glorious sunshine. The 100 team got us off to a cracking start with 3 double clears for a win with individual placings of myself 1st, James Foxon 2nd, Sophie Dutton 5th and Alex Eavis also on the team. The 90 team all jumped clear Xc and just lowered one show jump between them to finish 3rd. The team consisted of Sue Timmins, Nicola Broadbent, Alice Williams and Holly Brett who qualified as an individual. The 80 team jumped as a non qualifying team. I was lucky enough to ride Sara H-O's Rivi who gave me a super double clear. Mel Day also jumped DC with just some novice run outs Xc from Vicky B-W and Helen McCraken but remember no courses had been open for Xc schooling at this point!

The summer show jumping was held at the club field on the May Day bank holiday. The 70cm team with Lilli Hughes, Emma Hood, Gemma Gale and Holly Farrer won. Then Lorraine Green, Jess Josslin, Nicky Robinson and Holly Farrer won the 80.

For the championships Lorraine Green had a clash of events and we were unable to find a replacement so the 80 team had to go as a team of 3 and Jess Josslin took a second horse to replace Emma Hood in the 70.

Summer dressage was again a long day. Vicky B-W and Holly Brett rode prelim riding tests while Alex Eavis and Amy Crosby rode the novice riding tests. In the novice dressage team Vicky B-W, Holly Brett, Emila Hunnaball and Alex Eavis who picked up 5th individually finished 5th as a team.

The open team finished 3rd with individual placings of myself 2nd, Amy Crosby 3rd, Emilia Hunnaball 4th and Holly Brett 9th all riding different tests. My own horse Hallmark also finished 2nd in the medium by less than a mark for the second year running!!!

June 10th was the horse trials qualifier at Little Downham. I arrived to find the 80 team without a score – Shadowman and Nicky Robinson had slipped over after no. 1 in the SJ arena, which under new rules resulted in elimination and a couple of others missed fences Xc leaving no team score.

The 90 team did amazing with all 4 members jumping double clear for a team win with Nicola Broadbent individual 1st, Amy Crosby 3rd, Alice Williams 5th and a double clear from Alex Eavis.

The 100+ team followed with 3 double clears for another win with individual placings of myself 2nd, Sophie Dutton 3rd, Frankie Power 5th and Christine Reidy also being in the team.

Unfortunately the team was unable to attend the championships so Billericay RC got the qualifying space. The big attraction of the horse trials championships for the 90 and above is that the Xc includes roads, tracks and steeplechase. Unfortunately due to the hard ground produced by the hot, dry summer this part was dropped. Our 90 team travelled to Swaycliffe and only when the team was no longer in contention for a top place some sensibly pulled out to save their ponies for better conditions.

I've sadly stood down as senior team manager due to other commitments and have passed the batton back to Nicky Robinson for 2019.

It has been another busy year for the junior members. It was lovely to see some new people stepping forward to enter the teams and I hope more of you will put your names forward in 2019.

The Season started with;

FOTH Qualifier at Poplar Park 25TH March 2018

Acacia Coombs stepped in to join the 80cm team of Holly Gregory on St Clerans Cracker, Alanna Brosnan on Jimmy and Lucy Hinde on Craughwell Lucy. They all did really well as for most, this was there 1st competition this season and 1st time around a cross country course for some. They all completed the course and as a team came 1st and qualified for the Championships in May at Aston-Le-Walls. Individual placings were Lucy 2nd, Holly 3rd, Acacia 5th and Alanna 7th.

It was then the turn of the 90 team that unfortunately had been depleted down to 3 members. Lucy on Ozzie, Gracie on Danny and Beth on Finn. They all rode beautifully doing Double clears so it came down to time penalties to split the teams. The team ended up 2nd with individual placings of, Gracie 4th Lucy 5th and Beth 7th. As the highest placed non qualifying individual was not part of the winning team Gracie and Danny qualified for Aston le Walls.

Novice Indoor Championships 15th April 2018

Having qualified at the end on 2017 we had our Junior teams off to a new Championship venue at Arena U.K Grantham. Not an ideal place to stay for the competitors but the team spirit prevailed and they all had a fabulous time. For Hannah and Emelia it was the last events in the Junior team events before graduating to the Senior ranks.

Holly Gregory, Alanna Brosnan, Sarah Endean and Saffron Sutherland competed in the team show jumping, over an up to height technical course in a big indoor arena. After all jumping two rounds the team finished 10th.

In the dressage we had Sarah Endean and Emelia Hunnaball doing the P12 dressage test and Chloe Mason and Hannah Everitt the N28 test.

As a team they achieved 6th.place with individual placings in their Arena's Chloe 1st, Hannah 11th, Emelia 8th and Sarah 14th

Intermediate Winter Championships 29th April 2018

Having qualified at the end of 2017 we had two individuals heading off to compete at the Indoor Championships at Bury Farm. This is a very big venue and a great experience.

Lucy Hinde and Brynithon The Outlaw competed in the individual 90 cm Show jumping class. The course was very technical and up to height. Although no individual placing after two great rounds, a great experience.

We had Emilia Hunnaball competing as an individual in the dressage class. Emilia's last Junior Championship. They did a lovely test and were just out of the rosettes.

Area Showjumping Qualifier 7th May 2018

This was a very local event for us, competing on our home ground. The field looked amazing after being water logged and the committee had done a great job in getting it all prepared.

We fielded 3 junior teams and a style jumping team. For many it was the first outdoor event so far this year and for some the 1st time in a team competion.

We started with the style jumping teams with Alanna Brosnan /Jimmy and Matilda Simpson/Buzz competing in the 75cm section and Chloe Mason/ Cor De Corine and Sarah Endean/ Bunnmow Magpie competing in the 85cm section. They all rode beautifully and the team came 1st.

Then it was the turn of our 70cm team running on 3 members. Matilda/Buzz, Leilah Sutherland/Troy and Lauren Dunn/ Bobby Boy 2. This was the $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ time they had competed for the club. They all rode well to complete the 2 rounds and came $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ as a team.

Next was the turn of the 80cm team. Saffron Sutherland/ Archie, Acacia Coombs/Buddy, Alanna/Jimmy and Sarah and Fly. Well they were not going to be outdone by the 70cm team so they also came 1st.

Then it was he turn of the 90 cm team. This consisted of Chloe/Cor De Corine, Beth Mason/Finn, Acacia and her new ride Loubylou and Lily Cane/ Erinagh Beg who stepped in at 12th hour having not jumped for months, having to borrow a saddle to make the team up. After the two rounds the team finished 2nd with Lily and Erinagh Beg 1st individually.

Festival of the Horse 19th and 20Th May 2018

On the Saturday Lucy Hinde competed in the Combined Training as an Individual on Brynithon the Outlaw. They did a super test and clear show jumping. They came second in

their Arena collecting a well earned Sash.

On the Sunday we then had Lucy competing as an Individual in the 90cm Challenge and Alanna, Acacia and Lucy in the 80cm team Challenge (Holly was unfortunately unable to compete as Cracker was off games)

Lucy in the 90cm Challenge went clear in both phases, just a little too fast for an individual placing coming 17th out of 54 that completed the course.

In the 80cm team event there were a few issues and not easy on a team of 3. Alanna came 21st and Lucy 33rd both going clear out of 88 who completed the course.





Dressage Qualifier Ashfields 2nd June

Junior riders for this event consisted of, Alanna and Josie Brosnan, Sarah Endean and Chloe Mason.

In the riding test the girls came 2nd with individual placings for Alanna 5th and Chloe 3rd.

The girls then rode four different tests for the junior dressage team where they came 3rd with Chloe coming 2nd, Sarah coming 4th, Alanna 4th, Josie 5th in their arenas.

Chloe being the highest placed individual rider not part of the qualifying team in both her dressage and riding test qualified for the National Championships at Lincoln.

Little Downham Horse Trials 10TH June

Beth and Chloe Mason along with Alanna Brosnan and Jessica Simpson competed in the RC Horse Trials qualifier at Little Downham Eventing Centre. After competing across all three disciplines they were successful in the 80cm class with individual 1st for Beth, 3rd for Jess, 4th Alanna and 5th Chloe meaning a trip to the championships at Swallicliffe.

BRC NAF five star Horse Trial - 3rd August 2018 - Swalcliffe, Oxfordshire

Lucy Hinde, Alanna Brosnan, Beth and Chloe Mason headed up to Swalcliffe for the BRC Horse Trial Championships on 3rd August. For Alanna and Chloe this was their first ODE Championships.



We all arrived the afternoon before and settled the horses in and went off to walk the sj and xc courses. The xc course was 5mins and 40 secs long with 18 jumping efforts and two waters over hilly terrain.

The girls had respectable dressage times on the Friday not riding until 11am. They all rode really lovely tests doing well in their arenas. The show jumping followed with lovely clears from Alanna and Chloe, Beth and Lucy one pole each so going into cross country was looking good. Alanna, Beth and Lucy had a fabulous clear rounds with just time faults and Chloe, the least experienced cross country competed with a few hic-cups.

After a nailing biting wait, the girls were 4th overall and 2nd in the all four scores counting, what a day to remember.

Lincoln National Championships 2nd September 2018

Another successful BRC National championship was had by the Juniors with the 80cm team coming third and Sarah individually 2nd, style team 4th, Alanna 5th in the 75cm style individually, and Chloe and Gypsy 5th in the Riding Test. Well done to our 70 show jumping

team who rode amazingly well at their first Nationals.

Well done to Sarah Endean, Saffron Sutherland, Alanna Brosnan, Chloe Mason, Leilah Sutherland, Lauren Dunn and Sophie Akers who stepped in at the twelfth hour to make up the 70cm team

Lucy and Beth did the higher level HT100 with both girls riding their dressage test followed by jumping a course of 85cm jumps and Lauren and Isobel rode their first ever CT as part of the Junior team, jumping the 75cm course. All girls rode brilliantly and brought the team into 5th position. With Isobel in her first team competition for the Club gaining an individual placing

Chloe Mason and her pony Freddy was the only junior THRC competitor and rode two beautiful novice tests. Securing a win and a third and thus booking her third consecutive Novice Winter Championship place.

EQUINE INFLUENZA Every horse competing at qualifying competitions must have a valid 'flu certificate. This does not always apply to Area Only Competitions.

Valid Certificates-Vaccination Procedure

Each horse must have a valid vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that horse, completed, signed & stamped on each line by a veterinary surgeon who is not the owner of the animal. It must state that the horse has received 2 injections for the primary vaccination against equine influenza given no less than 21 days & no more than 92 days apart. (Only these 1st 2 injections need to have been given before the horse may compete). In addition a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days & no more than 215 days after the 2nd primary injection. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than 1 year apart, commencing after the 1st booster injection. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days, including the day of the competition or entry into the competition stables.

Producing Vaccination Certificate on Demand.

The vaccination certificate must, under penalty of elimination accompany the horse to all official competitions & the competitor is responsible for producing it on demand.

CONSTITUTION & RULES

1. The Club shall be known as the "TENDRING HUNDRED RIDING CLUB"

2. OBJECTS

Objects of the club shall be :-

- a) To encourage riding as a sport & recreation, to promote good fellowship amongst riders & to improve & maintain the standard of riding & horsemanship.
- b) To organise instructional meetings, lectures & competitive events & other activities deemed to further the objects.
- c) To be affiliated to the British Horse Society & to support & co-operate with recognised organisations interested in the breeding & use of breeds & types of Horse & Pony.
- d) To investigate the subject of bridle tracks & rights of way, with the view to opening those that have been closed & maintaining & more clearly defining those that are in existence.
- e) To concern itself with any object which will benefit the horse & horse user in the district.

3. MEMBERSHIP

This shall consist of persons of the age of 18 years (and persons 17 years & under if a Junior Section is formed) & have paid due subscription for the current period. Honorary membership may be conferred by the committee upon any person deemed by them to have rendered notable service to the club. No Junior member may be a voting member of any Riding Club. However, Clubs with Junior membership may appoint a Junior Committee to discuss matters relevant to the Junior membership. This committee, through the chairman of said committee may make recommendations to the Adult Committee for their consideration

- 4. The Annual subscription shall be payable on October 1st. Any member whose subscription is not paid by January 1st shall have his or her name removed from the membership list, after written notice has been sent to him or her. Any member joining after September 1st shall be deemed to have paid for the ensuing year.
- 5. The committee may expel (or temporarily suspend) from Membership of the club, any member who, or in the case of a Junior Member whose parent has wilfully disobeyed any of the rules of the club, or, who has in the opinion of the Committee been guilty of any conduct derogatory to the character or prejudicial to the interests of the Club, provided that before expelling him or her, the Committee shall call upon him or her for an explanation of his conduct & give proper opportunity of answering the allegations against him.

6. ADMINSTRATION

The Committee

- a) All powers of management shall be vested in the adult committee consisting of the Chairman; Honorary Secretary; Honorary Treasurer & at least 8 other adult committee members, 9 shall form a quorum.
- b) At the Annual General Meeting each year 3 members shall retire, the members to retire being those who have been longest in office, & as between those who have been in office the same length of time, the members to retire shall be determined by lot. Retiring members shall be eligible for re-election.
- c) The Chairman, Honorary Secretary & Honorary Treasurer shall be elected annually by the committee from among their number.
- d) The decision of the committee shall be final unless over-ruled at a General Meeting.
- e) The Committee shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of the rules & for anything relating to the club not provided therin & their decision shall be final & binding to all members.
- f) The committee may formulate Bye Laws for the detailed running of the club & elect a sub committee for any special activities of the club that the Committee may authorise.
- g) The committee shall have the powers to fill any casual vacancy arising amongst members of the committee, but any person
- so co-opted shall retain office only until the following Annual General Meeting & then they shall be eligible for re-election.
- h) A member seeking election to the committee must have paid a subscription to the Tendring Hundred Riding Club for the previous year.
- 7. The financial year of the club shall commence on October 1st each year.

- 8. The annual subscription shall be announced in the summer news letter.
- 9. The Committee shall appoint annually a President & a Vice President. These shall not by virtue only of such appointments become members of the Committee.
- 10 The Annual General Meeting shall be held in November each year to transact the following business:
- a) To receive & if approved, to adopt a statement of the Club's Accounts to the end of the previous year.
- b) To fill Vacancies on the Committee.
- c) To appoint an auditor.
- d) To deal with any special matter which the Committee may desire to bring before the members & to receive suggestions from the members for consideration by the Committee. Notice convening the General Meeting shall be sent to members not less than 10 days before the meeting & shall specify the matters to be dealt with.
- 11. A Special General Meeting may be called by the Committee or by a request signed by no less than 10 members specifying the business to be discussed. The secretary shall give all members 10 days notice of the date of such meeting & shall specify the matters to be dealt with.
- 12. The accounts of the Club shall be audited each year by the person appointed at the previous Annual General Meeting.
- 13. Notice may be given to any member by sending it by post to his or her address in the United Kingdom registered in the records of the Club. If any member has no address in the United Kingdom, such member shall not be entitled to receive any notice. The accidental omission to give notice to or the non-receipt of a notice of a meeting shall not invalidate the proceedings of that meeting.
- 14. These rules may be added to, repealed or amended by resolution at any Annual or Special General Meeting, provided that no such resolution shall be deemed to have been passed unless carried by a majority of at least two thirds of the members present & voting there on & provided that prior notice has been sent to all members stating the proposed amendment.
- 15a. Any Member picked for Team Events will be responsible for their own travelling expenses, transporting their own horses & for entry fees, unless the committee decide that these expenses shall be covered by club funds. Competitors must be fully conversant with the Affiliated Rule Book & abide by them.
- b) Any member accepting a place in a team representing the club in a qualifying team who does not keep themselves & their horse available for the finals, unless due to injury or ill health of horse & rider, will be liable to reimburse the Club all expenses incurred by the club.
- 16. The Club, the Committee or any person acting on their behalf shall not be responsible for any accident or injury to any person or property however caused.
- 17. Members shall be correctly turned out at all Club events. B.S. approved hats & correct footwear must be worn. A fine may be imposed or suspension if not adhered to. Various rules posted in the Secretary's Cabin regarding tack must be observed at all events.

18. **DISSOLTION**

In the event of dissolution, the assets of the club are to be divided equally between paid up SENIOR Members at that time and who have been members for the 4 previous consecutive years.

19. THE PROPERTY

The property of the Club shall be vested in 4 trustees who shall be appointed by the committee & the property of the club shall be vested in them to be dealt by them as the committee may from time to time direct by resolution (of which an entry in the minute book shall be conclusive evidence) the trustees shall be indemnified against risk & expense out of the club property. The Club Trustees shall hold office until death or resignation or removal from office by the committee. Where by reason of such death, resignation or removal it is necessary

that a new Trustee or Trustees be appointed, the committee shall nominate the person or persons to be appointed the new Trustee or Trustees. For the purpose of giving effect to such nomination, the chairman is hereby nominated as the person to appoint new trustees of the club within the meaning of Section 36 of the Trustees act 1925 & he shall by deed duly appoint the person or persons nominated by the committee.

20. If at any time the club in general meeting shall pass a resolution authorising the committee to borrow money, the committee shall thereupon be empowered to borrow for the purposes of the club such amount of money either at one time or from time to time & at the rate of interest & in such form or manner & upon security as shall be specified in such resolution & thereupon the Trustees at the direction of the committee shall make all dispositions of club property or any part there of, & enter into such agreements in relation thereto as the committee may deem proper for giving security for such loans & interest. All members of the club whether voting on such a resolution or not, & in all persons becoming members of the club after passing of such resolution shall be deemed to have assented to same as if in favour of such resolution.

STANDARD DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Save for death or personal injury caused by negligence of the Organisers or anyone for whom by law they are responsible, neither the organisers of an event to which the BHS Riding Club rules apply, nor the British Horse Society, nor any agency, employee or representative of these bodies accept any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.

EQUINE INFLUENZA Every horse competing at qualifying competions must have a valid 'flu certificate. This does not always apply to Area Only Competions.

Valid Certificates-Vaccination Procedure

Each horse must have a valid vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that horse, completed, signed & stamped on each line by a veterinary surgeon who is not the owner of the animal. It must state that the horse has received 2 injections for the primary vaccination against equine influenza given no less than 21 days & no more than 92 days apart. (Only these 1st 2 injections need to have been given before the horse may compete). In addition a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days & no more than 215 days after the 2nd primary injection. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than 1 year apart, commencing after the 1st booster injection. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days, including the day of the competition or entry into the competition stables.

Producing Vaccination Certificate on Demand.

The vaccination certificate must, under penalty of elimination accompany the horse to all official competitions & the competitor is responsible for producing it on demand.
