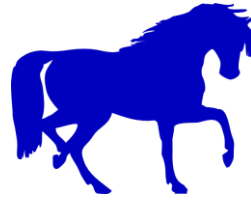

RING 1: Morning Classes (9am Start)

Class 1: In- Hand Senior Handler (Handler 17 years and over)

Class 2: In- Hand Young Handler (10 years and under) (Rosettes to all competitors)

Class 3: In- Hand Young Handler (11-16 years) (Rosettes to all competitors)

*****Handler Championship ~ 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 1-3 *****

Class 4: In-Hand Mountain & Moorland Small Breeds

(Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor 4 years old and over– to be shown in natural state)

Class 5: In-Hand Mountain & Moorland Large Breeds

(Connemara, New Forest, Highland, Dales, Fells 4 years old and over – to be shown in natural state)

Class 6: In-Hand Veteran

(Horse/Pony, any type/breed- 15 Years and over. Special rosettes for best horse/pony 20- 23 years & 24 years and over) ***Please state age of horse/pony when entering.***

Class 7: In- Hand Novice Horse or Pony

(Horse/Pony any type/breed, any age. ***Horse/Pony not to have won 2 x 1st places.*** May split horses/ponies if entries warrant)

*****Championship A ~ 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 4-7 *****

Afternoon Classes (not to start before 1pm)

Class 8: Ridden Novice Horse or Pony

(Horse/Pony, any type/breed, any age. ***Horse/Pony not to have won 2 x 1st places.*** May split if entries warrant)

Class 9: Lead Rein Pony

(Any breed/type 12.2HH and under – rider 10 years and under – snaffle bits only – lead rein attached to noseband. Rosettes to all entries)

Class 10: Ridden Veteran

(Horse/Pony, any type/breed- 15 Years and over. Special rosettes for best horse/pony 20- 23 years & 24 years and over). ***Please state age of horse/pony when entering.***

Class 11: First Ridden Pony

(Any breed/type 12.2HH and under – rider 12 years and under. Rosettes to all entries)

Class 12: Ridden Mountain & Moorland Large Breeds

(Connemara, New Forest, Highland, Dales, Fells, Welsh C & D – to be shown in natural state)

Class 13: Ridden Mountain & Moorland Small Breeds

(Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B – to be shown in natural state)

*****Championship B ~ 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 8-13 *****

RING 2: Morning Classes (9.30am start)

Class 14: In-Hand Thoroughbred/Re-Trained Racehorse

Class 15: In-Hand Hunter

Class 16: In-Hand Coloureds

(Horse/Pony, any type/breed, piebald, skewbald, spots, duns, palominos & roans.)

Class 17: In-Hand Cob/Traditional Cob

(Class may be split if entries warrant)

Class 18: In-Hand Blacks, Bays, Chestnuts & Greys

(Horse/Pony, any type/breed.)

Class 19: In-Hand Part Bred

(Horse/Ponies registered in the part bred section of their breed society e.g part bred Arab, part bred M&M part bred TB- to be shown plaited)

*****Championship C ~ 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 14-19 *****

Afternoon Classes (not to start before 1pm)

Class 20: Ridden Cob/Traditional Cob

(Class may be split if entries warrant)

Class 21: Ridden Hunter

Class 22: Ridden Thoroughbred/Re-Trained Racehorse

Class 23: Ridden Part Bred

(Horse/Ponies registered in the part bred section of their breed society e.g part bred Arab, part bred M&M part bred TB- to be shown plaited)

Class 24: Ridden Coloureds

(Horse/Pony, any type/breed, piebald, skewbald, spots, duns, palominos & roans).

Class 25: Ridden Blacks, Bays, Chestnuts & Greys

(Horse/Pony, any type/breed.)

*****Championship D ~ 1st & 2nd place winners from Classes 20-25*****

Ring 3 - Working Hunter Ring (10am start)

Classes – Commencing at 10am prompt.

- Class 28** **Beginners Working Hunter / Pony (Rider any age)**
Lead Rein or assisted allowed
Fences approx. 45cm (18")
- Class 29** **Very Novice Working Hunter / Pony (Rider any age)**
Lead Rein or assisted allowed
Fences approx. 55cm (1ft 9")
- Class 30** **Novice Working Hunter / Pony (Rider any age)**
Fences approx. 60cm (2ft)
Combination of pony and rider not to have won an open WH class
- Class 31** **Working Hunter / Pony (Rider any age)**
Fences approx. 70cm (2ft 3")
- Class 32** **Working Hunter / Pony (Rider any age)**
Fences approx. 75cm (2ft 6")

Working Hunter Classes shall be judged as follows:

- Each competitor jumps a course of rustic fences
- All clear rounds (or possibly those with a few penalties, depending on class) will be called back into the ring to perform an individual show as advised by the judge
- Competitors will then be placed according to the judge's marks (jumping style, individual show and conformation of horse/pony – bearing in mind its suitability as a 'hunter' type).

Tack and turnout for Working Hunter:

- Rider – Tweed jacket (ideally), shirt, tie, and light coloured breeches / jodhpurs. Brown or tan gloves, long boots (adults), short boots (children), approved standard riding hat / jockey skull. No spurs for juniors or Mountain and Moorland riders.
- Horse/Pony – any suitable bridle (martingales are allowed). Discreet numnah. Boots may be worn for the jumping phase only. Turn out according to type e.g. Mountain and Moorland's and cobs need not be plaited.

Tendring Hundred Riding Club Show Rules – Please Read

- Tendring Hundred Riding Club has taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid & prevent accidents occurring & must obey the instructions of the organisers /stewards whether written or verbal.
- Tendring Hundred Riding Club shall not be liable for any claim in respect of damage, loss, injury or accident to any person, horse or property howsoever caused. It shall be deemed a condition of entry that each entrant has read and understood these terms and conditions and shall indemnify T.H.R.C or any person acting on their behalf against any legal action arising from such an incident.
- To be eligible for points towards trophies you must be a member before the day of the show. For further information on trophies please visit www.tendringhundredrc.co.uk
- All ridden horses/ponies must be four years old or over.
- **Tack:** Ridden show classes – any snaffle bit, pelham or double bridle; cavesson nosebands only. No gag bits, flash or grackle nosebands (apart from working hunter classes where any suitable bridle is allowed). Lead-rein, first ridden, family pony – snaffle bits only.
- **Riders/handlers** to be correctly turned out i.e. jacket, shirt, light coloured breeches / jodhpurs, boots, tidy hair either in a **hairnet or tied above collar**. Junior handlers **must** wear a hard hat of the correct standard (see below). No spurs to be worn by juniors or in mountain and moorland classes.
- **Hats:** Must be worn to at least the following standard with a harness properly adjusted and fastened – skull caps must be worn with a silk. Riders must wear hats PAS 015 (998 or 2011), VG1 001.040 (2014-12), ASTM 1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), SNELL E2001 or E2016, AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards.) All with BSI kitemark or Inspec IC Mark. Any other standards/dates are **NOT** acceptable.
- All stallions/colts must be kept under control at all times and not handled or ridden by anyone under 14 years of age. **All stallions must wear a stallion disc on the bridle.** THRC reserve the right to ask that colts/stallions that behave in a dangerous manner be removed from the show ground.
- Please pick up all droppings.
- Please remove all rubbish/litter or place in the bins provided.
- Please keep all dogs on leads and clean up all droppings.
- All children under the age of 18 years must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.
- Judged under Affiliated Riding Club Rules. **The Judges' decision is final.**
- Only competing horses/ponies may be ridden on the showground on show days.
